

## Luke 10:1-3 (ESV)

<sup>1</sup> After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them on ahead of him, two by two, into every town and place where he himself was about to go. <sup>2</sup> And he said to them, “The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. <sup>3</sup> Go your way; behold, I am sending you out as lambs in the midst of wolves.



## Luke 10:4-7 (ESV)

<sup>4</sup> Carry no moneybag, no knapsack, no sandals, and greet no one on the road. <sup>5</sup> Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace be to this house!'

<sup>6</sup> And if a son of peace is there, your peace will rest upon him. But if not, it will return to you.

<sup>7</sup> And remain in the same house, eating and drinking what they provide, for the laborer deserves his wages. Do not go from house to house.



## Luke 10:8-9 (ESV)

<sup>8</sup> Whenever you enter a town and they receive you, eat what is set before you. <sup>9</sup> Heal the sick in it and say to them, “The kingdom of God has come near to you.”

## **Ephesians 2:12-14a** (ESV)

<sup>12</sup> “...remember that you were at that time separated from Christ, alienated from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers to the covenant of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. <sup>13</sup> But now in Christ Jesus you who were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. <sup>14</sup> For he himself is our peace...”

## **Luke 10:2** (ESV)

<sup>2</sup> And he said to them, “The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest.



## **Luke 10:10-12** (ESV)

<sup>10</sup> But whenever you enter a town and they do not receive you, go into its streets and say,

<sup>11</sup> ‘Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet we wipe off against you. Nevertheless know this, that the kingdom of God has come near.’


<sup>12</sup> I tell you, it will be more bearable on the day for Sodom than for that town.



## **Luke 10:13-15** (ESV)

<sup>13</sup> “Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! For if the mighty works done in you had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago, sitting in sackcloth and ashes. <sup>14</sup> But it will be more bearable in the judgment for Tyre and Sidon than for you.

<sup>15</sup> And you, Capernaum, will you be exalted to heaven? You shall be brought down to Hades.



## **Luke 10:16** (ESV)

<sup>16</sup> “The one who hears you hears me, and the one who rejects you rejects me, and the one who rejects me rejects him who sent me.”



## **John 14:12** (ESV)

<sup>12</sup> “Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever believes in me will also do the works that I do; and greater works than these will he do, because I am going to the Father.



## John 17:18 (ESV)

<sup>18</sup> As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world.



## **John 20:21** (ESV)

<sup>21</sup> Jesus said to them again, “Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you.”



## **Matthew 28:18-20** (ESV)

<sup>18</sup> And Jesus came and said to them, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <sup>19</sup> Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.”
