Why is the doctrine of the security of the believer important?


Addresses the sovereignty of God

An incorrect understanding leads to a focus on ourselves

Helps us see that our salvation is dependent on God and God alone

Romans 3:10-12

None is righteous, no, not one; ¹¹no one understands; no one seeks for God. ¹²All have turned aside; together they have become worthless; no one does good, not even one.

Sin has a price

Romans 6:23

For the wages of sin is death.

Jesus paid the price

Romans 8:2-4

For the law of the Spirit of life has set you free in Christ Jesus from the law of sin and death. ³ For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do.

Jesus paid the price

Romans 8:2-4

By sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and for sin, he condemned sin in the flesh, ⁴ in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit.

2. Christians will not sin
3. Anyone who claims that Jesus is Lord is secure

Passages meant to assure us of our salvation

And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ.

John 10:27-30

My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me. ²⁸ I give them eternal life, and they will never perish, and no one will snatch them out of my hand. ²⁹ My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all, and no one is able to snatch them out of the Father's hand. ³⁰ I and the Father are one.

1 Peter 1:3-5

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, ⁴ to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, ⁵ who by God's power are being guarded through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.

How can we be assured of our eternal security as believers?

Confusing passages that:

1. suggest we can “fall away”
2. suggest that our salvation is questionable
3. are warnings

1ST WEDNESDAY



Galatians 5:1-6

For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery. ² Look: I, Paul, say to you that if you accept circumcision, Christ will be of no advantage to you. ³ I testify again to every man who accepts circumcision that he is obligated to keep the whole law.

1ST WEDNESDAY

Galatians 5:1-6

⁴ You are severed from Christ, you who would be justified by the law; you have fallen away from grace. ⁵ For through the Spirit, by faith, we ourselves eagerly wait for the hope of righteousness. ⁶ For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision counts for anything, but only faith working through love.

II Peter 2:1

But false prophets also arose among the people, just as there will be false teachers among you, who will secretly bring in destructive heresies, even denying the Master who bought them, bringing upon themselves swift destruction.

II Peter 2:22

Look for evidence of fruit in your life

Be certain now

Rest on the truth

Meditate on and rest in the truth of the Scriptures
