# Galatians 6:1-5 (ESV)

Brothers, if anyone is caught in any transgression, you who are spiritual should restore him in a spirit of gentleness. Keep watch on yourself, lest you too be tempted. <sup>2</sup> Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ.

## Galatians 6:1-5 (ESV)

<sup>3</sup> For if anyone thinks he is something, when he is nothing, he deceives himself. 4 But let each one test his own work, and then his reason to boast will be in himself alone and not in his neighbor. 5 For each will have to bear his own load.

"We will exercise an affectionate care and watchfulness over each other, and if occasion requires, we will humbly please with one another to cease in sinful behavior and encourage the confession of sin to one another."

## Galatians 6:2 (ESV)

Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ.

## 2 Corinthians 5:4 (ESV)

For while we are still in this tent, we groan, being burdened—not that we would be unclothed, but that we would be further clothed, so that what is mortal may be swallowed up by life.

# 2 Corinthians 1:8 (ESV)

For we do not want you to be unaware, brothers, of the affliction we experienced in Asia. For we were so utterly burdened beyond our strength that we despaired of life itself.

#### 2 Corinthians 7:5 (ESV)

For even when we came into Macedonia, our bodies had no rest, but we were afflicted at every turn—fighting without and fear within.

## 2 Corinthians 7:6-7 (ESV)

But God, who comforts the downcast, comforted us by the coming of Titus, 7 and not only by his coming but also by the comfort with which he was comforted by you, as he told us of your longing, your mourning, your zeal for me, so that I rejoiced still more.

"We will rejoice at each other's happiness and endeavor to bear each other's burden's and sorrows, always remember to pray for one another."
